150 companies deployed for two-phase Bengal polls

Kolkata: The Ministry of Home Affairs on Wednesday told the West Bengal government that following the direction of the Election Commission of India (EC), it has decided to deploy 150 companies of additional forces, including personnel from the Central Armed Police Force (CAPF), India Reserve Battalion (IRB) and armed police wings from other states, will be deployed in each of the two phases of the upcoming Assembly polls in the state.

The TMC delegation, comprising its Rajya Sabha leader Derek O'Brien, deputy leader Sagarika Ghose, MPs Sanku Gokhale and Menaka Guruswamy, met the full bench of the Election Commission to raise the issue of alleged disenfranchisement of voters during the Special Intensive Revision of electoral rolls in poll-bound West Bengal.

Now, with the new communication from the Ministry of Home Affairs, the total number of forces to be deployed for each of the two phases of state polls will be 2,550. Of the 150 additional companies to be deployed, 85 companies will be from CAPF and the remaining 55 companies will be from IRB and armed police wings from other states.
